## Secondary School Admissions

If your child is due to transfer from primary to secondary school in September 2025. Local authorities coordinate secondary transfer admissions for all maintained (non-fee paying) schools. This means parent/carers should apply to the local authority in which they live (the council to which they pay council tax). You can apply for schools outside of the local authority in which you reside.

If you live in Birmingham, you should apply for your child's secondary school place online at [www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions](http://www.birmingham.gov.uk/schooladmissions) between 1 September and 31 October 2024. It is important that you submit your application by 31 October 2024. **Applications received after the national closing date of 31 October 2024 will be treated as late applications.** Late applicants are less likely to be offered a place at one of their preferred schools, as these applications will be processed after 1 March 2025, in accordance with Birmingham's coordinated admissions scheme.
