How we Spent the Money Last Year

- from September 2018, we have employed our own sports coaches who organises outdoor games during the lunchtime break with a range of pupils, support teachers with the delivery of Physical Education lessons in the afternoons (including the modelling of effective swimming coaching) and lead the delivery of after school sporting clubs
- provide transport to allow a range of pupils to compete in inter-school competitions including athletics, multi-skills, tennis, football, netball and many more
- train Year 5 Play leaders, who are selected following a stringent application process, to support KS1 and Reception pupils during the lunchtime break

Impact

- the P.E. leader has received high quality leadership training to support her in the management and leadership of this area of the curriculum
- Reception, KS1 and KS2 pupils engage in a wider range of structured sporting activities at lunchtimes because these are organised and led by the sports coach
- Teachers across the school are supported by the sports coach to deliver P.E. lessons, which encourages a higher level of engagement and activity, as a result of the more favorable teacher/pupil ratio
- KS1 and KS2 pupils engage in a greater level of sporting activities because of the level of involvement in inter-school competitions (last year the school took part in 5 competitions against other schools)
- School teams won many competitions not only at regional level but national too

- Reception and KS1 pupils engage in a higher level of structured sporting activities during lunchtimes because of the leadership qualities of the Year 5 Play leaders
- KS1 and KS2 pupils participate in a range of after school sporting activities because
 the school provides a wide range of clubs, including cricket, football (boys and girls),
 hockey, multi-skills and many more (364 pupils had engaged regularly in after school
 sporting clubs over the entire year)

How we intend to spend the money this year

- to continue employing our own highly skilled sports coach; who organises outdoor games
 during the lunchtime break with a range of pupils, support teachers with the delivery
 of Physical Education lessons in the afternoons (including the modelling of effective
 swimming coaching) and lead the delivery of after school sporting clubs
- equipment for outdoor sports that the Sports Coach and teachers have identified as necessary to deliver effective Physical Education lessons
- to train new Year 5 Play leaders, who are selected following a stringent application process, to support KS1 and Reception pupils during the lunchtime break
- continue subscribing to online PE scheme of work and assessment grids
- Swimming Pool booked for Year 3 and 4 to have swimming lessons (including poolside tutors)

Achievement in Swimming

- 84% of pupils in Year 6 were able to swim 25m by the end of the academic year 2024/2025
- parents of pupils, who have not yet achieved their 25m swimming badge, have been informed of the importance of developing their child's swimming confidence and competence for safety and health reasons

The school achieved the Sainsbury's School Games Award (Silver Level) in the Autumn Term 2014 in recognition of our efforts to encourage sport.
